This means that our school could be reopened if a need was demonstrated, but otherwise will not be operational. Future decisions to close or extend the school in recess will be an ongoing decision.

We thank the many supportive community members that we have spoken to about our school, but sadly, without enrolment numbers we can no longer operate. We will be planning something to end the year on which we will also include our community (COVID willing) so keep your ears and eyes open.

Meanwhile we continue to teach and provide a positive and caring school for our students and families.
